

Checklist of Consumer Disclosures

Instructions: The first step in completing the checklist below is identifying whether the disclosure exists at your institution. If it does not exist, determine if it is applicable to your institution. If it is not applicable, you should indicate the reason (i.e., no campus housing).

Once you have determined whether the disclosure exists, indicate the URL if it is available electronically; or, if it is only available in paper, indicate the location of the paper version including the title of the document and the page number where the disclosure is located (for instance, "page 3 in college catalog"). You can also use the last column for any other notes about the disclosure. If your institution is selected for a program review, you may be asked to complete a similar checklist.

The checklist below represents documents/information requested by the U.S. Department of Education from a university that was selected for a program review; it is only representative of what might be requested and should not be considered official or complete.
